- 2. Search the library holdings for additional sociology sources. This includes professional journals, <u>The New York Times</u>, the International Encyclopedia of Social Sciences, or other related information. Reread the course outline for bibliographic information.
- 3. Write about your selected minority group bringing together your sources. Feel free to cover areas such as income, occupation, education levels, immigration and demographic breakdown. Simple cross-tabulations will give you sufficient descriptive data and controls will enable your work to be more analytical. However, you are not required to use controls. The data you use must be included in the paper.
